Workers Compensation Compliance Audit in the Security Industry

The purpose of this correspondence is to advise you of the upcoming workers' compensation audit in the Security Industry in the ACT.

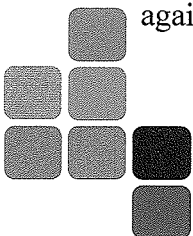
WorkSafe ACT is the government agency responsible for regulating the ACT *Workers Compensation Act 1951* (the Act), and as such provides an advisory and inspectorate function on a range of workers compensation and occupational health and safety matters to assist employers and workers.

The Act aims to provide timely, safe and durable return to work through effective injury management and income support to injured workers. It works in conjunction with occupational health and safety legislation, which seeks to reduce the human and economic cost of work-related injury through improvements in the management of occupational health and safety in the workplace.

WorkSafe ACT is about to undertake a workers compensation audit of the ACT security industry to be carried out in June/ July 2010. The aim of the audit program is to ensure compliance with legal requirements under the Act and promote awareness within the industry.

As part of this audit, Workers Compensation Inspectors may either visit or write to employers' within the Security industry. Inspectors will be focussing on whether employers maintain a current ACT workers compensation policy and ensuring that employers are not providing false information to their relevant workers compensation insurer to benefit from a lower premium.

WorkSafe ACT will write to a random selection of employer's within the industry within the next week to provide information about the audit and will be requesting certain information to be provided. This will give each business time to address any shortcomings they might have with regard to their workers compensation requirements and opportunity to have them corrected. Should the employer fail to respond, the employer may be visited by an inspector or further action may be taken against them.




