Job Description

A Project Contract Manager oversees projects from start to finish, ensuring the work is completed to the agreed time and budgets. They work on projects in many different sites, from commercial to government.

As the Project Contract Manager, you will be responsible for overseeing all contractual aspects of projects, ensuring compliance with legal requirements, and mitigating risks. Your primary role will be to review, negotiate, and manage contracts with clients, suppliers, and subcontractors.



On the Job

The Project Contract Manager is responsible for overseeing and managing all contractual aspects of a project from initiation to completion. Among the day-today job responsibilities include:

- Develop and implement effective contract management strategies, ensuring compliance with legal and organisational requirements.
- Review and negotiate project contracts, including terms and conditions, • scope of work, deliverables, and pricing.
- Collaborate with stakeholders, such as clients, vendors, and legal teams, to ensure clear communication and understanding of contract requirements.
- Monitor contract performance and ensure adherence to timelines, milestones, • and quality standards.
- Identify and mitigate risks associated with contracts, including identifying potential conflicts, changes in scope, or budgetary issues.
- Manage contract amendments, extensions, and terminations, ensuring proper documentation and adherence to contract terms.
- Provide guidance and support to project teams regarding contract-related matters.
- Maintain accurate contract records and documentation for future reference and audit purposes.
- Stay updated on industry trends and best practices related to contract management to continuously improve processes and outcomes.
