- Collaborating with clients' internal teams to ensure the integration and successful implementation of security measures.
- Staying up-to-date with the latest security trends, technologies, and regulatory ٠ requirements to continuously enhance clients' security posture.
- Conducting security awareness training sessions for clients' employees to promote . a culture of security and ensure adherence to best practices.
- Responding to security incidents and conducting thorough investigations to . determine the root cause, remediate the issue, and prevent future occurrences.
- Preparing detailed reports and presentations to communicate assessment findings, recommendations, and risk analysis to clients' stakeholders.
- Providing ongoing support and guidance to clients, addressing their security concerns and assisting with incident response as needed.
- Maintaining strong relationships with clients and serve as a trusted advisor on all matters related to security.

Entry Qualifications & Training

Your role of a Security Consultant with responsibility to advise on matters of safety, protocols and procedures, organisations will place high regard on experience and qualifications. Depending upon the specifics of the consultancy, a security licence may be required. Some jurisdictions require qualifications to obtain a security consultant / adviser licence. To qualify, you will need to consider the following.

- Hold a Security Licence to consult and advise on security matters.
- Demonstrate experience in providing and applying advice and consulting services.
- Demonstrate required training or a Certificate IV in Risk Management, Certificate IV in Cyber Security or other IT training and qualifications. *
- Have prior work or experience working as a security team leader, security supervisor or security site manager.

* Funded Certificate training is available in some states/territories.
