Job Description

As a Security Training Manager, your primary responsibility will be to develop, implement, and oversee comprehensive security training programs for our employees. You will work closely with cross-functional teams to identify training needs, design engaging training materials, and deliver effective training sessions.

The training manager is responsible for the organisation's internal training requirements and/or the provision of training that may include certificate training, provided through a Registered Training Organisation.



On the Job

Among the day-to-day job responsibilities include:

- Developing and implementing comprehensive security training programs for employees to ensure adherence to company policies and procedures.
- Assessing training needs and identifying gaps in security knowledge and skills.
- Designing and delivering engaging and interactive training sessions, workshops, and online modules to enhance security awareness and knowledge.
- Collaborating with cross-functional teams to integrate security training into onboarding and ongoing professional development programs.
- Staying up to date with the latest security threats, industry best practices, and regulatory requirements to ensure training content is current and relevant.
- Evaluating the effectiveness of training programs through assessments and feedback and making necessary adjustments to improve outcomes.
- Provide guidance and support to security personnel regarding training requirements and certifications.
- Maintaining training records and documentation to ensure compliance with internal policies and external regulatory standards.
- Conducting regular audits and inspections to identify potential security vulnerabilities and recommend corrective actions.
- Serving as a subject matter expert on security-related topics and participate in incident response activities as needed.

- A security training manager should possess leadership qualities, be able to motivate and inspire their team, and effectively allocate resources.
- The ability to analyse security training needs, identify skill gaps, and develop appropriate training solutions. Strong problem-solving skills are essential for addressing unique security challenges and providing practical solutions.
- They should actively seek new knowledge, stay updated with emerging trends, and continuously improve their own skills.
- They should demonstrate professionalism, maintain confidentiality, and prioritize the security and privacy of all training activities.
