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Job Description

As the owner of a security business, you will be responsible for the overall management and growth of the company. Your primary role will involve developing and executing strategic plans, establishing and maintaining client relationships, and ensuring the efficient operation of all business activities.

A business owner role is not normally an advertised role to apply for unless other parties are looking for a business partner.



On the Job

Among the day-to-day job responsibilities include:

- Overseeing the daily operations and management of a security business, ensuring compliance with industry regulations and company policies.
- Developing and implementing strategic plans to expand the business, increase client base and maximise profitability.
- Hiring, training, and supervising a team of security personnel, providing guidance and support to ensure high-quality service delivery.
- Conducting regular assessments of client needs and provide tailored security solutions, including risk assessments, threat analysis and emergency response protocols.
- Fostering strong relationships with clients, addressing concerns, resolving issues and maintaining customer satisfaction.
- Staying up-to-date with the latest advancements in security technology, industry trends and best practices to enhance service offerings.
- Managing financial aspects of the business, including budgeting, invoicing and financial reporting.
- Collaborating with local law enforcement agencies, government entities and industry associations to stay informed and participate in relevant initiatives.
- Maintaining proper documentation and records, ensuring compliance with legal and regulatory requirements.

Salary & Benefits

Your starting salary can vary because of factors like the size of the security business, the number of clients and naturally the revenue earning capacity of the business and the associated costs of operating the business.

Small business owners of a startup security business may earn less than some of their employees. Sound business practices and the drive to succeed can see business owners receive significant benefits over time.





Entry Qualifications & Training

Given your role as a security business owner, you are responsible for the operation and success of the business. A small security business will see the owner(s) working in the business and in that capacity the owner(s) will need to hold relevant security licences to undertake the security activities offered and performed. Naturally the business will also need a security business licence to operate.
