Job Availability

The private security industry in Australia is robust generating revenues of more than \$11 billion per year, performing a vital role as part of the Australian economy. As a dynamic and growing industry employing over 200,000 professionals, as a force multiplier the industry performs a crucial role in safeguarding the Australian community.

Security personnel are required across all sectors of the economy, from state and federal government agencies, retail, hospitality, manufacturing, transport, telecommunications, energy, hospitals, mining, entertainment and more. What this means is that there are an enormous range of opportunities available.

2. Diverse Roles

The security industry encompasses a wide range of roles and positions. In the Protective Security sector these include Security Officer, Concierge, Security Consultant, Aviation Screening Officer, Cash in Transit Officer, Loss Prevention Officer, Private Investigator, Compliance Officer, Crowd Controller and Security Consultant.

In the Electronic Security sector this ranges from Trainee Security Technician, Trainee Locksmith to Senior Security Technician, Monitoring Centre Operator, Estimation/Sales, Project/Contract Member, Engineering Manager, Trainer, or IT/Cybersecurity Manager.

This diversity allows individuals to choose a role that aligns with their personality, interests and skill set.

Depending on the sector and role you choose to work in and your location, you will need to obtain relevant licenses and certifications. The security industry in NSW is regulated by the NSW Police Security Licensing Enforcement Directorate which sets out the training competencies required to obtain a licence. These competencies and certifications will enhance your employability and open doors to various career paths.

A career in the security industry will help you develop a wide range of important and transferable skills, including problem-solving, critical thinking, communication, teamwork, observation, conflict resolution, and attention to detail. For example, if you have strong customer service and communication skills you may be suited to a role as a Security Officer, whereas if you are technologically minded with a strong engineering interest, a role as a Security Technician may be a better fit.
